# NAVY CYCLISTS

From Monday 2 April to Tuesday 11 April, an incredible team of 8 from the 825 Naval Air Squadron from the Royal Navy Air Station at Yeovilton took to their bicycles to take on the challenge of riding from Land's End to John O'Groats to raise money for the Somerset Neonatal Intensive Care Unit to purchase oxygen assist modules. They raised an incredible £13,105.

Mark said, "it was my mission to raise money to help purchase oxygen assist modules, to save valuable time for the team who were wonderful, caring, attentive nurses who will be able to spend more time providing different types of care".

The team travelled the length on the UK covering a total of 921 miles over 9 consecutive days (this challenge is usually completed in 14 days). They climbed the equivalent of Mount Everest 1.5 times, and they did it is just over 60 hours, setting a pace of 15.3mph.

A huge thanks and congratulations to the team and their support team for this amazing adventurous challenge. This was nothing short of incredible, especially and some of the team had never cycled such a distance before.

# VOYAGE OF RECOVERY 2023: We did it!

On Friday 28th of April a team of eight patients cared for by our early intervention in psychosis team arrived safely into Plymouth, having sailed 169 miles in six days- Part funded by Love Musgrove.



"Our eight young people endured a 20hour passage, sailing through the night in freezing, wet conditions and rough seas, with many succumbing to seasickness – it was such a challenge! It was all part of the Voyage of Recovery, which involves young people who've experience psychosis embarking on a sailing activity to promote recovery by strengthening social and emotional relationships, with the aim of building their selfesteem and confidence.

Dr Estelle Rapsey, one of our clinical psychologists and the clinical lead for our early intervention psychosis service, said this year's voyage has been a resounding success.

"We're so pleased to have been able to run the voyage again this year as the benefits to the eight young people who took part are clear to see." she said.

"One told me that it had given him a new sense of self-confidence that he'd never had before, and another said is made everything in his life much clearer. Three members of the team were interviewed by ITV Westcountry the week after the voyage and I was bursting with pride at how positive they were now feeling.

"The Cirdan Sailing Trust organised the voyage – a full circumnavigation of the UK – and this year we completed the second leg, from Portsmouth to Plymouth. "Our eight young people endured a 20-hour passage, sailing through the night in freezing, wet conditions and rough seas, with many succumbing to seasickness – it was such a challenge!

"But the rewards were plentiful as we were treated to a beautiful sunset and sunrise, starlite skies, dolphins dancing alongside us, and a sunbathing seal. We took part in many activities on board too, including card games, sea swims, laughter and lots of singing!

"So many memories and friendships were forged, confidence built, and a new sense of self-belief for many as we worked as a team to support each other, connect with nature and share stories of hope and recovery.

"Everyone earned their Royal Yachting Association 'Start Yachting' certificates and left with a huge sense of pride and achievement."
