# A ride for Ava and Teddy

On 11 June, a team of 18 brilliant riders took to the Somerset countryside to raise money for the Somerset Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (SNICU). Their target was to ride 1,000 miles but they smashed it and completed 1,170 miles!

In April 2021, twins Ava and Teddy were welcomed into the world at just 30 weeks. With their early arrival, they spent 6 weeks being cared for by SNICU. Mum, Millie said "the care Ava & Teddy received from each and every member of the team was truly amazing, and this unit will now always hold a very special place in our family's heart."

Many wonderful friends and family not only cycled but helped along the way and over £12,000 was raised. The money will be used to buy 4 Neopuff Resuscitation devices which will help to resuscitate babies when they stop breathing.

# Royal Society award shortlist for our homelessness team

Being homeless doesn't mean you should not be able access care when you need it. With the number of people becoming homeless increasing, we set up a specialist homeless nursing team as a trial back at the beginning of 2021, funded by the Somerset Integrated Care System, and was made permanent last autumn.

Our homelessness nursing team for Somerset has been shortlisted for a prestigious Royal Society of Public Health (RSPH) award for 'health and wellbeing'.

It has grown over the last year with registered nurse Karen George taking up the role as clinical lead for the service in January 2022. Karen has built up a team of six experienced nurses, four health link workers and a team administrator.

"This nomination came as a nice surprise as we are a very new team," Karen said. "We know that help and support with health inequalities is very much needed in our communities.

"With the current cost of living crisis, the number of homeless people and

those at risk of becoming homeless is sadly increasing, which means our team caseload is continuing to grow.

"We provide healthcare and support for anyone who is homeless in Somerset that has a health need, supporting people who are in difficult situations, from those living in hostels and sofa surfers, to those released from prison, sex workers, gypsies and travellers – anyone without a permanent home.

Our homelessness nursing service provides a range of healthcare services for people:

- · Basic Health Checks
- · Wound care
- Blood tests, including Hep C/Hep B/ HIV testing/Syphilis testing

- · Help with medical appointments
- Advise and support with medication concerns
- Sexual health promotion, contraception advice and STI checks
- · Dental health promotion
- Swabs, removal of stitches/staples
- Confidential advice/advocacy.

"Many people we support won't necessarily come into healthcare settings regularly," Karen continued. "We will see them whenever and wherever they need us – such as on the street, in a field or in hostels.

"We aim to make every contact count, we also arrange drop-in sessions at hostels, YMCAs and other locations in the community. Building trust with this group of people has enabled us to help reduce the demand on our emergency departments and minor injuries units, as well as GP practices. Our team also supports with attendance to appointments, as well as onward referrals to relevant specialities.



Our 25th Anniversary Appeal is well underway. Thanks to donations from the Somerset Community, and beyond we have been able to fund some of the projects to benefit patients across the Trust.

- Meaningful Moments boxes for 72 clinical areas - filled with items to support patients with dementia such a light projector, scrapbooks, colouring books, word searches, sensory toys, and practical items such as hearing aid batteries and glasses wipes.
- · Massage chair at Rowan Ward in Yeovil for their recently created new sensory moon
- · iCare Tonometer for Minehead Community Hospital. This tests the pressure inside the eyes and is used to test glaucoma and

to measure how to the treatment is working

- · Hydrotherapy pool based at Dene Barton Community Hospital, the money has been used to fund enhancements such as a large mural, plants, and a oiber
- Bladder Scanner for Portman Ward at Musgrove. This is also thanks to a donation from a Trust and Foundation
- · Older Adult DBT (Dialectical Behaviour Therapy) to develop the service for adults in the community to help them talk through their emotions,

understand them, and learn skills to manage them.

The team covered the distance of 5,000 km by cycling, swimming, and walking and raised £541.00

Veronica Price, the NHS trust's clinical outreach librarian who took part in the challenge said: "We chose the Bibliotheca Alexandrina as it is the closest site to one of the largest and most significant libraries of the ancient world and holds a special place in the hearts of all librarians.

"It's really exciting to see the wide range of projects that people's donations will support this year as part of our 25th anniversary appeal and the direct impact this will have on our patients, their families and our colleagues."
