The money will be used to purchase an Ambulatory Infusion Pump so that medicine can been administered continuously or intermittently so that a patient can receive chemotherapy or medicines at home instead of being in hospital.

HYPNOPAL RESEARCH STUDY

As part of the 25th Anniversary Appeal, we funded an existing piece of research, led by our clinical nurse researcher, Ana-Maria Toth.

The study is exploring whether hypnosis can reduce pain following colectomy surgery - the only study of its kind in the country! It looks at the way post-operative patients perceive pain having had hypnosis as part of their post-operative treatment versus a control group.

Ana hopes her research will help to offer a medication-free solution to pain management.

The hypnosis is offered in addition to pain medication so I would suggest modifying this medication free solution to perhaps an additional therapy that would help with pain

Unlike hypnosis you may have seen on the TV with a swinging pocket watch, Ana is offering safe and controlled sessions to 40 patients as part of the study – one session prior to surgery, one 24 hours after, and a third session three days post operation where she will record their levels of pain and general wellbeing.

Typically, a combination of medication is used to help with pain, but these can cause adverse effects such as nausea and vomiting.

"We're using hypnosis in a really positive way to see if it benefits a patient's care - at the very least it will relax patients and we hope that the trial will show many other benefits too"

Patients are currently being recruited to take part and you may have seen this on the TV and in various newspapers.

This project also has the potential to provide evidence which could be used to inform system change/ quality improvements in relation to the surgical patient pathway and interventions to improve recovery and reduce hospital stay.

The event originally started back in 2017, but was for a different charity at the time. Ken and lain originally decided to start Cycle 42 because both Ken and his wife both had treatment at the Beacon Centre at Musgrove Park Hospital. The event had 60 people registered.

The next year, in 2018 Ken and Iain decided to donate the proceeds in a 50/50 for the Breast Appeal at Yeovil Hospital Charity and the Beacon Centre. Iain was quoted as saying 'Investing in the local community, is a more effective way to make a difference'. Iain also has a personal story as to why he has such a passion to fundraise, his daughter was also treated for cancer since setting up this event. Ken, during his treatment said that he was blown away by the care he and his wife received. Saying 'it felt like we had a private hospital treatment. 'Time and

effort costs nothing, but can make a world of difference' was a quote he used to paint a picture of his time with the Beacon Centre.

Since 2018, the event has continued to grow from strength to strength and is an incredibly smooth day. What started as a friends and family event has quickly grown into an event that can host over 100 people, with people donating through raffles, registration fees and JustGiving pages.
